Administration Updates <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Retaining aspects of the previous logo the Friends logo has been updated, this has been done to make it more compatible with the new website. As mentioned in the previous meeting, Becky Wotherspoon has kindly offered her services (https://www.fivespoons.co.uk/) to create a website for the Friends. At this time, we really need to be able to take online payments for events we are running. A website will enable us to do this as well as providing an online platform to advertise events and ask for help. It's hoped that this could also build more of a community, helping people to get involved with the Friends by providing one place where they can find out everything we're doing. The hope is to have the website up and running in January, with the ability to place orders for Santa Letters in December. 5. Roof <ul style="list-style-type: none"> At the last meeting (08/10/2020) Mrs Bhabra asked if the Friends would consider donating £7,000 towards the cost of the repairs to the roof. The school roof is leaking and in need of repair/replacement, costing £140,000. As the school is owned by the church the diocese will fund 90% of repairs, the remaining 10% (£14,000) is to be paid for by the school. The school's finances have been hit hard covering the excess repairs from last year's vandalism and becoming "covid-safe", Mrs Bhabra has asked the Friends if they are willing to donate half of the costs. This was put to the meeting and all attending agreed to ring-fencing the funds. If you have any concerns please Email the Friends.

<p>6. Current Projects</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shed <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Teds Sheds have very kindly provided a replacement shed for the reception outside space. Due to the lockdown imposed since the last meeting, the school were unable to accept all the offers of help to build the shed, but two volunteers, Colin Waldock and Steve Adams, were allowed to build the shed (socially distanced of course!). A huge thank you to them and to Teds sheds (www.tedssheds.co.uk). – Becky Wotherspoon to prepare a social post to thank Teds sheds. • Environment Day <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – As there were so many offers of help, it was suggested that we have an "Environment Day", where a team of volunteers come to help with maintenance of outdoor areas of the school. Will be put on hold until current restrictions are lifted. • Cakes4Kids <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Tesco kindly donated enough cakes for all the children in the school to have a treat at the end of term. We hope to repeat this in the new year. • Hot Dog Day <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – All the profits from Hot Dog day go directly to the Friends and the school. This could be highlighted more to the school community. • Christmas Cards <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Have proved quite popular, suggested that next year we use a company where you can order online. • Christmas Pudding <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Sales a bit slow, £150 of £200 minimum met, class reps to advertise to school community. Order deadline 18th November 2020. • Turkeys <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Minimal input, any sales earn the Friends money, class reps to advertise to school community. • Santa Letter <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Letters have been drafted by Amelia Gledhill and sample paper ordered. GDPR concerns raised about the Friends having addresses.
